UK Research Councils

- 7 Research Councils in the UK (http://www.rcuk.ac.uk):
 - Arts and Humanities (AHRC)
 - Biotechnology and Biological Sciences (BBSRC)
 - Engineering and Physical Sciences (EPSRC)
 - Medical Research Council (MRC)
 - Natural Environment (NERC)
 - Economic and Social Research (ESRC)
 - Science and Technology Facilities (STFC)
- Supported by UK government to facilitate science
- Similar to NIH, AoF, DFG, not so much RAS
- Total budget: 2008/09 £3.11 billion =~ €3.7 bln
- Grants and own institutions
- Single administration
- No academy bodies

- Goals:
 - Encourage and support research to improve human health.
 - Produce skilled researchers.
 - Advance and disseminate knowledge and technology to improve the quality of life and economic competitiveness of the UK.
 - Promote dialogue with the public about medical research.

Medical Research Council (MRC)

- Started as independent scientific body in 1919
- Non-governmental research organisation supported by UK Parliament grant-in-aid itself
- Annual budget 08/09 of ~£700 mln =~ €840 mln
- ~2/5 given as grants and ~3/5 as intramural funding
- 32 intramural Units and Institutes across the country. Total ~4000 people.
- 3000 grant recipients
- 1300 peer reviewed publications a year (2008)
- NOT part of the National Health Service but working closely with it.

MRC Cognition & Brain Sciences Unit (MRC CBU)

- Founded in Cambridge in 1944 as Applied Psychology Unit (APU)
- Among former directors: Donald Broadbent, Alan Baddeley...
- Unit's remit changed in the 90's. Since 1998 it is known as the CBU. Director: W. Marslen-Wilson
- ~145 people (scientists, students, support, admin, visitors etc)
- Not part of Cambridge University!

- CBU is a research-only institution
- Not part of University
- No obligation for staff to teach or practice
- Still, MRC has a goal of producing skilled researchers, so there is a number of teachingoriented activities in collaboration with universities and schools:
 - Visiting students
 - Summer placement students
 - Part II undergraduate projects
 - Doctoral (PhD) theses

PhD education at MRC CBU

- CBU can provide basis for PhD thesis work
- Lively postgrad community of 20+ people
- Supervision normally 2 supervisors per PhD student
- Facilities fMRI, MEG, etc.
- Lectures and seminars at CBU and in Cambridge
- Annual application deadline for PhD programmes in December

PhD education at MRC CBU

- Registration: students have to be registered at a University
- CBU is not educational institution and does not give degrees – PhD degrees are granted by universities
- Normally, this is Cambridge University they will accept the student as long as the CBU supports the application and there is financing
- It does not have to be CU, enrolling at another UK/European University is possible (but more cumbersome)

PhD education at MRC CBU

- Finance: there is no charge for PhD program at CBU
- But: UK universities charge tuition (and other) fees
- EU students pay over £3K a year to study at Cambridge, non-EU ~£15K
- Finance should be demonstrated to become enrolled: fees and maintenance (~£10K p.a.)
- Grants are available from MRC and other institutions

PhD education at MRC CBU

http://www.mrc-cbu.cam.ac.uk/postgraduate/ Procedure:

- Contact potential supervisors in advance
- Submit application (incl. research plan) electronically
- Shortlisted candidates always interviewed
- Selected candidates can be recommended for grants
- MRC studentship (normally 3 per year): covers tuition and maintenance for EU students for 3 years
- Other studentships managed centrally by CU
